STREET REPAIR:

Street/ pot hole repair will begin in June weather pending. This is a reminder that when the town workers have a section of street blocked off while they repair it, it is your responsibility to avoid that street. It is for the workers safety that the sections of streets are blocked off, not to inconvenience you.

If you are reported to the RCMP for failing to acknowledge the road block you are subject to a \$125 fine as per Section 226 of the Transportation Safety Act.

COMPOST:

As a reminder the Compost pickup program is on Wednesday mornings and it is for grass clippings, leaves and small twigs and branches that are bundled and tied together. The compost material must be in a container, no larger than 20 gallons capacity, with a lid to prevent rain entering the container and weighing it down over 40 pounds Or 18 KG or heavy duty plastic bags.

Compost is NOT : Large trees that you have cut down on your property or large tree branches. It is also not sod that has been dug up to make a garden plot. These are to be taken to the landfill by the property owner. The land fill hours are:

The Handivan is available for rent. It can be booked for rental by calling the Town Office at 375-2525. The Driver requirements as per our operating authority are: A Class 4 license or better (3,2,1). A Class 5 licence is acceptable when there are passengers with physical disabilities only. TRAFFIC BYLAW 05-2013

We would like to bring to the attention of property owners the following items in the Town of Kyle Traffic Bylaw concerning parking of vehicles that have been brought to the attention of Bylaw Enforcement officer:

10) Parking Prohibited:

c) No driver of a vehicle whether making delivers from the vehicle or not, obstruct the free passage of traffic on any street, land or sidewalk.

f) No person shall stand or park a vehicle on any street, boulevard or any other town owned property unless it displays license plates for the current year or a valid permit in lieu thereof.

i) Truck and Trailer Parking:

i) No personal shall leave a licensed trailer or semi-trailer parked on a public boulevard or any other town owned property which is unattached from the vehicle used for moving same;

ii) Licensed trailers used solely for the transportation of contractor and construction equipment shall be exempt from the provision of section I.

iii) No vehicle over one (1) ton or semi-trailer attached or unattached to a motor vehicle shall be parked on a street, boulevard or any other town owned property in any residential district at any time, unless actually engaged in loading or unloading furniture, goods or merchandise;

2017 PROPERTY TAX LEVIES

The 2017 Town of Kyle Budget has been passed and the 2017 levy will be a base tax of \$500 on property plus \$300 on improvements and a mill rate of 11 mills. A detailed explanation of the new base tax plus mill rate vs the previous tax levy calculations of Ad Valorem (mill rate only) will be included with the Tax Levy mail out. This mail out should be completed by June 16, 2017.

REGIONAL RECYCLE CARDBOARD

Please note that our Regional Recycle still accepts cardboard, so please **DO NOT** put your cardboard in the TRIWAYS Recycle container. *Use the Regional Recycle containers that are in the same spot as before.*

Our Regional Recycle bales all of the cardboard in **OUR** containers and **GETS PAID** for it when it is sold. TRIWAYS charges us for the rental on their bin and to load and unload it. **PLEASE DO NOT FILL IT UP WITH CARDBOARD!**

The company that purchases our cardboard has a 5% of weight contamination limit. This means that any cardboard that is recycle MUST have under 5% contamination. So, where do Pizza boxes fit it? **YES** they can be recycled; but **NO** they cannot have any food left in them or the greasy circle of paper they sit on. So make sure the box is clean before you put it in **THE REGIONAL RECYCLE CARDBOARD CONTAINER BINS!**
