2018 Business License:

Business Licenses are due now for 2018. A business license is required for

"all persons carrying on any of the businesses, industries, callings or occupations defined in this bylaw who are not already assessed on the tax roll of the Town for such trade, occupation or business. Or those persons who due to the nature of their business are required to be licensed." So what this means is, if you do not pay a commercial property tax for a business that operates in the Town of Kyle, you are required to have a business license. This includes all door to door salespeople, home based businesses and street vendors. A copy of the bylaw as well as the application and fee schedule are available at the town office. All businesses with a current business license will be listed in the business directory on the town website. Please include a business card for your business with your license.

We appreciate the community's assistance reminding businesses to get their licenses and refraining from purchasing goods or services until this has occurred.

The Traffic Bylaw was recently updated and what is new to this bylaw is a time frame for how long a vehicle can sit on the street. There are instances where vehicles are left for months at a time on the street without moving. Please check the area where your vehicle is parked on the street. If it is a narrow street with parking on both sides it can be a hindrance to regular street traffic. As was recommended to us by the Bylaw officer and time has been included in this new bylaw

(10)(k) - Time limit Parking

- No vehicle shall be parked on any street, or lane for a continuous period of time in excess of 96 hours
- ii) Clause 10(k)(i) shall only be enforced when the vehicle is creating a nuisance or hindrance.
