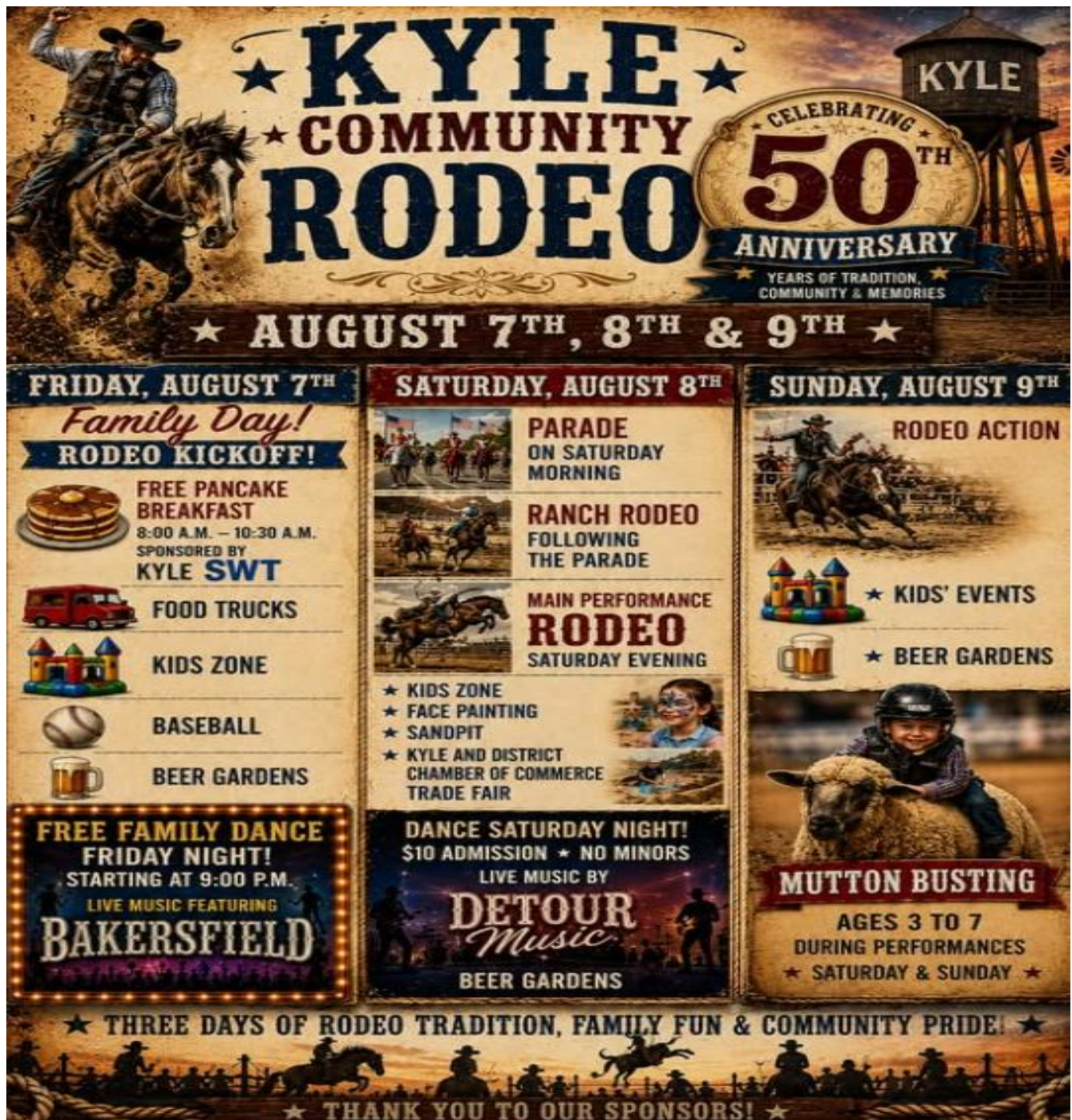

2026 Targeted Grazing Project, by The Hamm Ranch

The 2026 targeted grazing project at Sask Landing Provincial Park was completed successfully between May 22 and June 24, 2026. Despite an extended project duration resulting from exceptional spring moisture, increased forage production, and a conservative initial stocking rate, the planned treatment areas were completed and the vegetation management objectives outlined in the contract were achieved.

Grazing management remained adaptive throughout the project. Increasing livestock numbers improved grazing efficiency and reinforced the importance of matching stocking density to forage availability. Forage utilization generally met or exceeded the project target of approximately 80% across the treatment areas. Livestock performance remained strong throughout most of the project, with a significant livestock health challenge encountered near the conclusion of grazing. The issue was identified quickly, managed appropriately, and provided important operational experience for future grazing projects involving dense stands of kochia.

Public interaction throughout the grazing period was overwhelmingly positive, providing opportunities to engage park visitors, school groups, and organized tours while demonstrating the role of targeted grazing as an effective vegetation management tool. Aside from one operational incident that was resolved promptly without public safety concerns, the project fulfilled the vegetation management objectives established for the site.

Hot dry weather for August



Saskatchewan's August weather begins with extreme heat and dry conditions across agricultural zones, followed by a brief long-weekend cooldown and a generally warmer-than-average monthly trend.

An intense upper-level ridge is trapping heat across the region, keeping southern and central zones highly prone to dry field conditions.

Expect a hot start to the month with temperatures peaking in the mid-to-upper 30s over the August long weekend, possibly flirting with 40°C in localized areas. A Pacific front will bring a modest cooldown by Monday, dropping daytime highs back to seasonal norms in the mid-20s. Southern regions will remain mostly dry, though isolated storms are possible.

Wildfire Risk - Extreme. Constant heat and minimal rain have dried out surface vegetation.

Harvest & Field Safety - Critical. Regional fire departments, including the RM of Swift Current Fire Department & Kyle Fire Departments, are warning producers about baler and grass fires. Ensure farm equipment carries working extinguishers and keep water tanks nearby.

Heat Warnings - Active. Humidex values are pushing into the low 40s in major centers. Limit outdoor exertion during peak afternoon hours.

Nature Sask. urges caution around endangered piping plovers



Piping Plover - *Charadrius melodus*

The piping plover in Saskatchewan is an endangered, small migratory shorebird where the province supports one of the world's largest breeding populations. They arrive in late April or early May and nest directly on open sandy and gravelly shorelines until early August.

Key Identification and Habits

- **Appearance:** Sandy-grey back, white belly, bright orange legs, a single black neck band, and a black band across the forehead.
- **Distinction:** Often confused with the killdeer, which features two black neck bands instead of one.
- **Nickname:** Called "moving rocks" because their pale camouflage blends into beach gravel.
- **Nesting:** Females lay about four eggs in shallow ground scrapes lined with tiny pebbles during June.

Major Breeding Locations in Saskatchewan

- Lake Diefenbaker
- Chaplin Lake, Reed Lake, and Old Wives Lake
- Quill Lakes, Manitou Lake, and Willow Bunch Lake

Conservation and Threats

- **Status:** Listed as endangered under Canada's Species at Risk Act.
- **Risks:** Vulnerable to human disturbances, including all-terrain vehicles (ATVs), trucks on beaches, and unleashed dogs.
- **Help:** Managed via programs like Nature Saskatchewan's *Plovers on Shore*, which tracks nesting pairs and encourages public reporting of sightings.
